WHAT is the PAL Card?

For some people with disabilities, it's impossible to go places without someone's help.



A PAL card allows people with disabilities to be accompanied by an attendant FREE of charge or at a reduced rate! This will allow people with disabilities to access many services in Cambridge without having to consider the financial implications of an attendant.

WHO is Eligible for a Card?

YOU are, if you meet the following conditions:

- 1. Your disability restricts you from performing activities within the range considered 'normal'.
- 2. Your disability can NOT be eliminated with the use of a technical aid, such as eyeglasses.

But my disability isn't permanent?

You can still apply for a temporary card. Examples of a temporary disability could include: stroke recovery, a broken limb, post-operative mobility issues, or any other temporary condition that meets the criteria listed above.

Approval is based on the ability to meet eligibility requirements.

HOW do I get My PAL Card?

- 1. Complete the enclosed application. If you are unable to complete the form yourself, ask someone to assist you with the process, or have them complete it for you.
- 2. Return your completed application to: Andrea Rilev, Recreation Co-ordinator, Inclusion & Access. City of Cambridge Community Services Department, 2nd Floor 73 Water Street N., P.O. Box 669 Cambridge, ON N1R 5W8 OR Fax to (519) 740-3011
- 3. Once your application has been reviewed, you will be contacted via telephone and receive a letter including guidelines associated with the program.
- 4. Once you have received your letter, you should bring it to the YMCA, where you will have your photo taken. The YMCA of Cambridge is located at 250 Hespeler Road. Your PAL Card will then be processed and issued.

5. Enjoy your community.

The PAL Card is intended to increase your ability to access your community with the help of your personal attendant.

6. Spread the word! If you know someone who could benefit from this program, encourage them to apply.

PAL The Personal Attendant for Leisure Card

What is a PAL Card?

For some people with disabilities, it is impossible to go places without someone's help. A PAL (Personal Attendant for Leisure) Card allows people with disabilities to be accompanied by an attendant – FREE of charge!

The PAL Card:

- 1. Identifies that the person named on the card requires the assistance of an accompanying personal attendant. All regular program fees/registration fees apply.
- 2. Authorizes that the accompanying personal attendant will not be charged Registration or Admission.

Who is eligible for a PAL Card?

You are eligible if you meet the following 2 (Statistics Canada) requirements for disability:

- 1. You are a person with a disability and your disability restricts you from performing activities within the range considered normal and,
- 2. Your disability can NOT be eliminated by the use of a technical aid like eyeglasses.

If you have a disability but it's not permanent, you can still apply! Approval will be based on whether you meet the two requirements listed above.

If you just had surgery and will need assistance only for a little while you will be issued a "Temporary" PAL Card, as long as you meet the above criteria.
