PHONE USE



Have you ever been out with a friend and you are trying to have a conversation and they are texting or staring down at their phone instead of paying attention to you? How does this make you feel?

Unfortunately, this same situation is experienced by individuals that EAF supports and the person on the phone is their Direct Support Person. Relationships are very important at Extend-A-Family and if you are on your cell phone, what message are you sending the individual you are supporting, their family and the community? Can you be an active listener and an ambassador for inclusion if you are distracted by your phone? Remember, you are a representative of Extend-A-Family in the community and we want the community to notice your amazing work, not how quickly your fingers can move across a screen. So the next time you are with the individual you are supporting, please think twice before checking your phone. Instead, put the phone down and create an opportunity for face to face conversation.

On-Call Policy Reminder:


It is important that all Direct Support People carry an emergency information card for the people you support in case of an emergency while you are with them.
